MOTION TO AMEND

THAT the action recommended be amended to be replaced with the following wording:

BEING A BY-LAW TO AUTHORIZE ENTRY TO PROPERTY PURSUANT TO SECTION 132 OF THE MUNICIPAL ACT 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, AS AMENDED.

WHEREAS the Ontario Municipal Act 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25 Section 132 (1) A local municipality may authorize the owner or occupant of land to enter adjoining land, at any reasonable time, for the purpose of making repairs or alterations to any building, fence or other structures on the land of the owner or occupant but only to the extent necessary to carry out the repairs or alterations. 2001, c. 25, s. 132 (1).

Conditions

- (2) The following apply to a power of entry under a by-law under this section:
 - 1. The power of entry may be exercised by an employee or agent of the owner or occupant of land.
 - 2. A person exercising the power of entry must display or, on request, produce proper identification.
 - 3. Nothing in a by-law under this section authorizes entry into a building.
 - 4. The owner or occupant shall provide reasonable notice of the proposed entry to the occupier of the adjoining land.
 - 5. The owner or occupant of land shall, in so far as is practicable, restore the adjoining land to its original condition and shall provide compensation for any damages caused by

the entry or by anything done on the adjoining land. 2001, c. 25, s. 132 (2).

AND, WHEREAS the Town of Cobourg encourages resolution of disputes between neighbours with regard to temporary access on adjacent lands for these purposes; and recognizes disputes are infrequent but can pose a serious issue to property maintenance and safety when access has been denied; and seeks to provide a means to settle issues as best as possible,

AND FURTHERMORE, WHEREAS the Town of Cobourg has various permit processes, including Building Permit Fee Structure By-law 78-98 which contains a detailed description of the permit process including Definitions and Conditional Permit,

THEREFORE, a municipal permit for access as described in this Right of Entry (ROE) Bylaw No. (XXX) is required upon review of the application request by the designated municipal inspector.

AND, FURTHER THAT, where the inspector, applicant or neighbour determines a lack of information or misunderstanding may be at root of disagreement between adjacent property owners, the ROE permit process shall provide mediation before a permit fee and damage deposit are processed by the Town. In addition, the mediation process is defined as part of the ROE By-Law and may include staff from one or both the Legislative and Planning Departments, or, may be referred by Town Staff to the Property Standards Committee.

AND FURTHER, in addition to conditions set out in Section 132 (2) OMA, the ROE By-Law shall include a permit process which clearly describes the scope of work, including but not limited to:

The neighbour or their acting agent/service contractor seeking a ROE shall:

- sign a declaration describing the extent of proposed works, why they are essential, acknowledges the limitation on uses of the adjoining lands;
- provide identification for inspection if requested by the adjacent land owner or by-law officer/planning official;

- provide a security deposit identified by the Town, depending upon the nature of proposed access and works as low or high impact ROE damage (minimum \$500);
- provide at least 72 hours' notice in writing and by registered mail to the owner and occupant of the adjacent lands before entering of the adjacently, including length of time needed;
- mitigate nuisances including dust and noise;
- restore adjacent lands to original condition and provide compensation for any damages caused by entry or anything done;
- hold the Town of Cobourg and adjacent landowner harmless in the event of any damages to people or property as a result of work;
- obtain any permits required in advance of work and entry to adjacent lands;
- adhere to all other applicable federal, municipal and provincial legislation and regulations that apply.

AND FURTHER that, the Town Inspector may authorize an exemption based on need for emergency access.

AND FURTHER THAT Council requests Staff prepare a draft by-law which addresses protocols and processes to be presented at the Committee of the Whole meeting of (XXX).

FURTHER THAT the fine for parking in a designated accessible parking space be raised to \$600.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council approve the request from the Accessibility Committee for no charge parking in any municipal parking spot with a valid accessible Ontario parking permit in the Town of Cobourg.
