Governance Review Summary

Council approves the following direction

THAT Council support the detailed review of the Council Governance Structure in principle and that the following recommendations be presented as alternative governance model of the Standing Committee System to the current Portfolio System; and

FURTHER THAT, since both systems and their variations are in use by municipalities in Ontario, the public survey would clearly summarize and compare the two main alternatives and be reviewed by a newly formed Governance Review Working Group and with input from all Council members. The approved public survey would be sent for public engagement for initial presentation and feedback with the following proposals:

- 1. Standing Committee System described in the Staff Report and with recommended variations which would replace the current Committee of the Whole System into four (4) Standing Committees and/or mix of Standing Committees and a Committee of the Whole and a Regular Council Meeting happening each month with each Standing Committee having a specific mandate based on the previous coordinator meeting system which includes the combination of participation of all Council Members and three (3) Council Members on the recommended Standing Committees Types. It is anticipated the total number of Standing Committee and Council meetings each month will not exceed four.
- 2. Council maintains the Statutory Local Boards and Advisory Committees being, the Accessibility Advisory Committee and the Heritage Advisory Committee, and others which may be mandated from time to time. Council may enact Citizen Advisory Committees to Council and consider the creation of Task Forces and Ad Hoc Committees based on the Council Strategic Plan with a specific mandate to achieve Council goals and initiatives during the Council Term with an end term and expiry no longer than twelve (12) to eighteen (18) months, or at the end of their mandated purpose.
- 3. FURTHER THAT the following question be added to the Governance Review Survey regarding the introduction of Town Hall Meetings.








Governance Review Open House


The Municipal Clerk hosted an Open House in Council Chambers on May 17th 2023 from 6:30 P.M. to 9:00 P.M.

- Purpose of the Open House was to hold an informal forum for residents to seek clarification on the current Council Governance model, and to provide information and answer questions on the proposed option.
 - ➤ 12 residents attended the Open House to ask questions and seek clarification from Staff on Governance;
 - ➤ Various comments and concerns were voiced on the removal of some Advisory Committees, comments on direct public participatory engagement options, and the risk of not having all members of Council on each meeting of Council.




I understand how I can communicate with Council

provide outcomes from surveys, so we understand if and how feedback from community members has been used to implement changes.


Comments and Recommendations:

Need to find a way to get a larger number of residents involved in community matters rather than just listening to those that are the loudest.


An online form for residents to put a correspondence onto the committee agenda.

A weekly overview of decisions, explained in layman terms on both social media and the website would be useful. Not many understand how to access this information.


timelines are often too short for comments or participation particularly when there is only one date to participate.



Have you personally appeared before the Town of Cobourg Council?




Have you personally sent in correspondence to be received by Council?




Have you personally appeared to speak before a Town Advisory Committee?




My experience in appearing before Council was constructive and worth my time.




I believe my interests and concerns were heard and given consideration.

Council should know ahead of time what will be presented to them so they can research any related information.


Comments and Recommendations:

I found that only being able to answer questions somewhat frustrating when there was discussion amoung the councillors and it became clear that some councillors misunderstood the message.


Information about the process of being a delegate is hard to find and confusing.

Delegations on the same topic should be made aware of others, to avoid overlap where possible.


Q: Should the timing of delegations remain the same or should delegations relating to a specific agenda item take place at the beginning of that discussion by Council?




Information on issues that are being considered by Council are easy to find.




The information on issues that are being considered by Council is useful and easy to understand.




I believe Council provides effective oversight of the Town performance, relating to timelines and efficient reporting from staff on items to the council floor.




I believe Council provides efficient reports and engagement on the Town's budget and finances throughout the year.










Council ensures that the Town addresses resident priorities through delivering Council Strategic plan goals and objectives.






I believe Council overall makes decisions based on what they believe is in the best interest of the community.

Q: On a scale of 1 to 10, with 1 being the lowest and 10 being the highest, overall, how satisfied are you with the governance of the Town?






Comments and Recommendations:

It would be great if decisions made by Council could be summarized in a digestible way...This could easily be relayed in the Mayor's email and on social media.


More public meetings outside council chambers to address key issues. Information needs to be posted in plain English on the town's website (not PDF attachments).... instruct staff to write reports in plain english,




Inclusivity: Residents have a fair and reasonable opportunity to participate in decision making.




Transparency: Information is openly available and easy to access and understand.




Accountability: I trust Council's oversight and responsibility for the process and the performance of the Town and services.




Efficiency: I believe that Council conducts the operations of the Town in a timely manner, effectively using resources and in accordance with the Council Strategic Plan.



Effectiveness: I believe that Council is doing a good job at achieving desired results and addressing resident priorities.




Impartiality: I trust that the decisions of Council are unbiased and made based on the best interest of the Town.




Would you support a change in the Town's governance structure?




I feel Advisory Committees provide a value to Council decision making.




I would be more inclined to join a Committee of Council if the meetings were less formal.


I would sit on an Advisory Committee of Council if the term of appointment was 12 to 18 months to accomplish a specific task asked of Council.
